CORONAVIRUS REOPENING POLICY

The lobby at Town Hall will open on Monday, June 1, 2020 with the following policy in place. Administrative office hours are Monday-Friday 8 a.m.-5 p.m.

Only one party will be permitted in the lobby at a time to provide social distancing. All others shall wait outside until the first party vacates the lobby to enter. For the purposes of this policy, a “party” is defined as an individual or group of individuals living in the same household such as a parent with children or an adult couple. Mask will be required for residents/customers wishing to access the lobby.

We ask that you continue to use the other available options to conduct Village business when possible. Water/Utility Bills can be paid online at locklandoh.org, over the phone at 513-761-1124 with credit card or the payment drop box located outside the lobby entrance.

Trash set-out and set-back courtesy service to the elderly and handicap residents that have an application on file, will begin Tuesday, June 2, 2020.

Truck rentals will begin Monday, June 1, 2020. Please call Town Hall to reserve a truck at least 24 hours in advance. Trucks are available at a first come, first serve basis.

Trash disposal/dumping at the Service Garage will begin Monday, June 1, 2020. Dumping will be available on Monday of each week from 10 a.m.- noon. Please call Town Hall to schedule at least 24 hours in advance. There is a fee of \$10 to be paid upon scheduling.

Trash Containers are available for purchase at \$75 each. Please call 513-761-1124 to purchase. Public Works Department will deliver to your address.

Village Parks are open for recreation and exercise. Playgrounds, basketball courts, exercise equipment and restrooms will remain closed; park and ballfield rentals, recreation hall rentals will remain suspended until the state order is lifted.

SPORTS REFUNDS

TRASH AND RECYCLING COLLECTION

Rumpke has experienced a 30% increase in volume since the beginning of the stay-at-home order. Families at home, cooking, cleaning out basements and garages equals an increase in trash. This has delayed residential trash and recycling collection or can cause collection times to be later than normal. They are doing their best to keep collection days and times the same, please give them time to make collection before assuming they are not coming. If your trash or recycling is not collected on your assigned day, please call Rumpke at 1-800-828-8171 to report. Reminder- Upholstered furniture and mattress/box springs must be wrapped in plastic to be collected. Notify Rumpke 24 hours in advance for Large pick up items. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Congratulations Lockland residents! In 2019, we recycled 84.07 tons of metal, glass, plastic, and paper and a diversion rate of 6.23%. Residents saved resources, conserved energy, and reduced pollution by not sending these items to the landfill. This is up from 2018 which was 29.68 tons and a 2.48% diversion rate.

The recycling efforts in Lockland:

- Conserved enough energy to power every home in Lockland for 3 days.
- Reduced more air pollution than if every household in Lockland rode their bicycle to work for 2 weeks.
- Saved 726 trees from being harvested.
